

WINFIELD RECREATION COMMISSION
MINUTES OF NOVEMBER 9, 2020

The November meeting of the Winfield Recreation Commission was called to order at 1:02pm by Chair Scott Gill. Members present were Jason VenJohn, Joe Wood, Marcia McIntire and Robyn Tapia.

There was no one present for public comments.

The minutes of the October 12, 2020 meeting were reviewed. Robyn Tapia moved and Jason VenJohn seconded the motion to approve the minutes as amended.

In reviewing October bills, Moree presented a list of additions totaling \$2,923.23. Robyn Tapia moved and Jason VenJohn seconded the approval of the payment of bills in the amount of \$41,101.94.

The financial report was given by Superintendent Troy Moree as he indicated the expenditures for the month of October totaled \$53,712.43 and year-to-date expenditures of \$415,005.07 which represents 44% of the general fund expended. Expenses in the Employee Benefit Fund totaled \$7,894.54 and year-to-date expenditures of \$36,093.58 which represents 28% of the fund expended. Revenue received for the month of October included generated revenue through fees and charges of \$18,613.57 and tax revenue of \$6,623.83 for a total of \$25,237.40. Year-to-date totals include tax revenue of \$50,939.67 and generated revenue of \$118,327.01 for a total of \$169,266.68. Year-to-date revenue in the Employee Benefit Fund is \$8,768.21. Cash balance in the general fund was \$447,046.65 cash balance in the Employee Benefit Fund was \$35,447.43 and cash balance in the petty cash fund was \$150.00 for a total cash balance of \$482,644.08. Cash balance in the checking account was \$55,732.44 and cash balance in the money market account was \$426,761.64. Cash balance in the Special Activities Account was \$7,311.83.

The October participation report was given with the Fitness Center membership standing at 1,095, activity participation at 6,441, pool activities at 1,210 and senior activities at 0 for a total of 7,651.

Donated Vacant Lot

The commission discussed ideas on what to do with the property at 1439 Olive that was donated to the Winfield Recreation Commission. After some discussion, Marcia McIntire moved and Robyn Tapia seconded the motion to give Moree the authority to list and sell the property.

Playground Project Update

Moree informed the commission that the work to install the new WRC playground should begin in late November. There will be a ribbon cutting ceremony when it opens to the public.

Candi Fox gave the Assistant Superintendent's report.

Fall Activity Enrollment Totals

Fox presented the Fall enrollment totals. 8 for Early Bird Workout, 27 for Fit Over Fifty, 19 in Gentle Yoga, 6 in Fit Flow Yoga, 12 for Silver Sneakers, 9 for STRONG Nation, 7 in Zumba, 17 in Pink Out Workout, 15 for Aqua Cardio Strength & Stretch, 5 for Silver Sneakers Splash, 16 for Mini Vikings Football, 21 for Mini Vikings Basketball, 22 for Gymnastics, 10 in dance and 8 for Spin Classes.

Movie Day

Fox presented a flier for a FREE movie day on Thursday, November 5 when school is not in session. The movie Free Birds will be shown at 1:00pm in the gym.

Pringles Ring Challenge

Fox presented a flier on a virtual Pringles Ring Challenge. Participants must complete the ring of Pringles chips and post their photo on the WRC Facebook page on November 5 and 6. Any family that successfully completes the challenge will receive a prize.

Cornhole Tournament

Fox presented a flier on the Cornhole Tournament that will be held on Saturday, November 7th at the Winfield Fairgrounds. The tournament will be a blind draw format starting at 1:00pm.

Turkey Basketball Skills Competition
